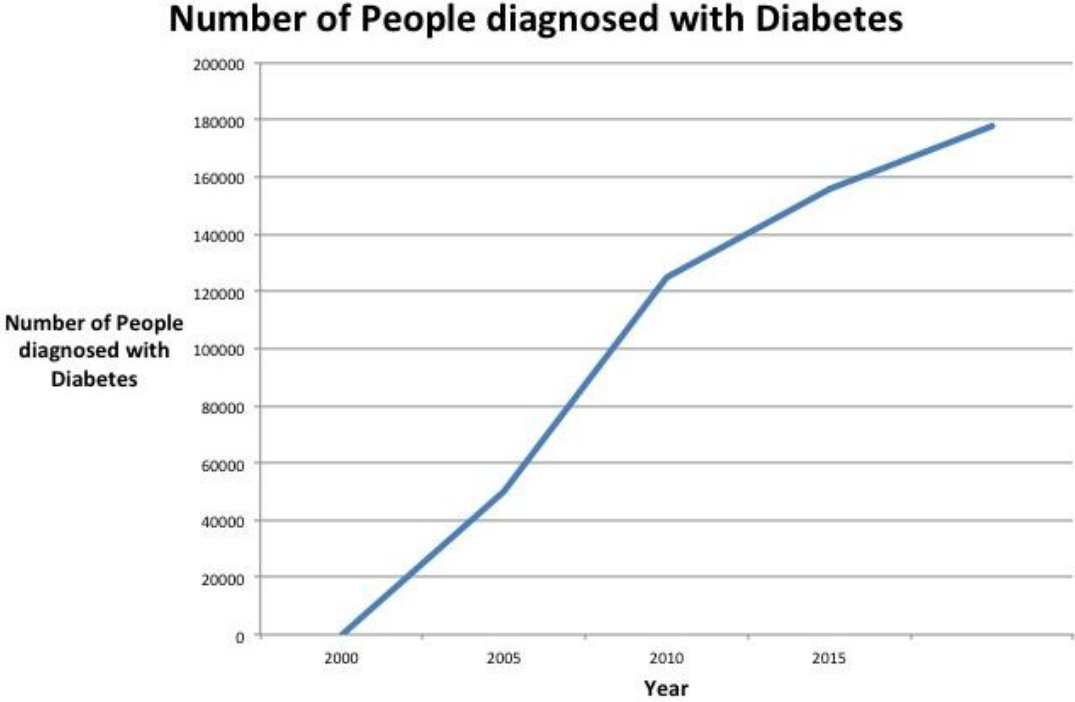

Q6: Figure 1 shows the number of new cases of diabetes diagnosed



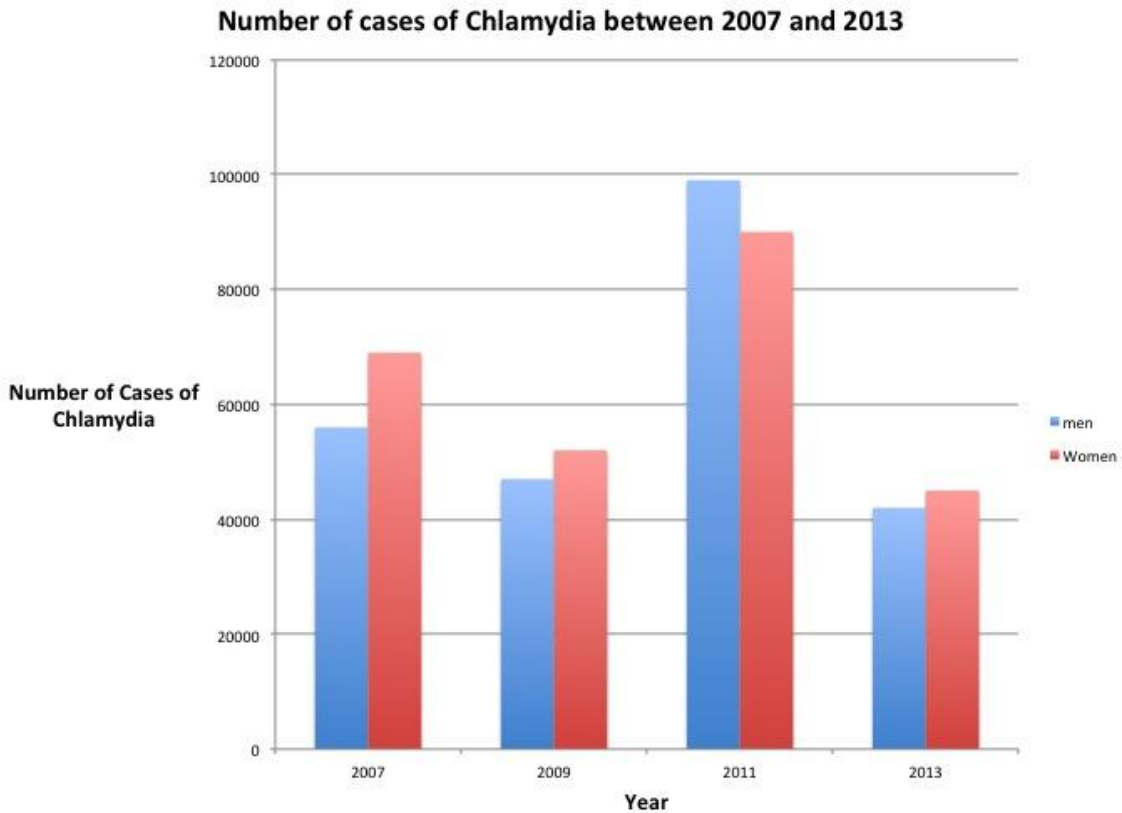
i) Describe the trend seen in the incidence of diabetes.
