#### **Decisions**

#### **Jobs**

Many jobs are advertised in online magazines and newsletters, so register with as many of these as possible. The internet has made the world smaller and has increased your opportunities.

Depending on where you are looking, you may need to get applications, references or CVs translated and there are programs to help you do this online. You may have to travel to attend an interview or answer questions via video conferencing.

#### **Legal requirements**

The need for work permits and visas should be researched.

Health insurance could also be a problem if you don't buy it before you go. You don't want to be flying home every time you are unwell.

#### **Culture**

Moving to a new country is very different to going there on holiday. Getting used to a new way of life, new people and a new culture takes time and effort. However, this could be one of the most enjoyable aspects of moving abroad. Soak up the experience and learn from it; it shows adaptability for your CV. You will have new places to visit and perhaps a new language to learn while you're there.

#### **Communication**

Moving abroad doesn't mean cutting yourself off from the people and places you have known before. Skype, email and instant messaging mean that family and friends can still be a few clicks away.

#### **Commitment**


